LeCroy Center Provost Going to USDLA Hall of Fame

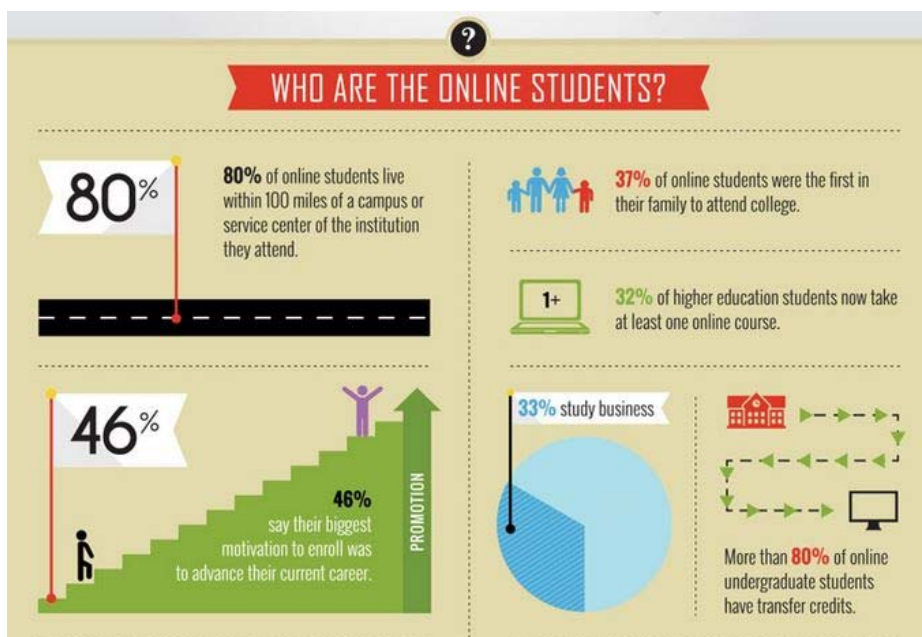


The LeCroy Center Provost, Dr. Pam Quinn has been chosen by the United States Distance Learning Association (USDLA) Board of Directors as one of the recipients of the 2015 USDLA Hall of Fame Award. The Hall of Fame Award is presented to an individual who has contributed significantly to the field of distance learning through leadership, technology, research and teaching.

Dr. Quinn stated that she was very humbled and thrilled to be getting this recognition. According to Dr. Quinn, "I was at the VERY FIRST reception to announce the formation of USDLA at a conference in Anaheim in the mid-80s. The founding meeting, I was there. So this is, indeed, an honor". The award will be presented at the USDLA national conference on April 27, 2015 in St. Louis, Missouri.

Quick Tips to Boost Student Engagement Online



Studies have shown that student satisfaction with their online courses directly correlates to the social presence of the instructor. Students who are engaged in their work are energized by four major goals—success, curiosity, originality, and satisfying relationships. The FAST Team (Faculty Access to Supportive Technology) has tools that can help create instructor presence in the online classroom, while allowing faculty to be creative using media resources and tools.

Using Twitter for Assignments: To Use or Not to Use



This post from [ProfHacker](#) (January 2015) explores some of the benefits and drawbacks to one of my most successful teaching exercises using Twitter. “Live tweeting” basically means tweeting or commenting online as students are watching a program, either by reporting on or commenting on what they are viewing.

- Live-tweet gives the instructor an idea of how the material is being received
- Allows the instructor to intervene in the students’ learning
- This active learning exercise helps students feel more engaged; students take ownership over the ideas that they generate
- Instructors can retweet or “favorite” tweets which offer good insights and feedback
- Helps to shift the direction of students who may be having trouble understanding
- Live-tweeting results in a set of notes that can be achieved and shared later

Texas Looking at Solutions for State Authorization for Online Classes

LeCroy Center provost, Dr. Pam Quinn attended the National Council for State Authorization Reciprocity Agreements (NC-SARA) board meeting in Atlanta in the fall, to get the latest findings on state authorization for institutions offering online classes. The NC-SARA Board is working through the details of how to set up a national system to allow institutions to follow state laws while enrolling students in other states. The Texas Higher education coordinating board is submitting proposed wording for legislation so that the state of Texas can join NC- SARA. Currently the DCCCD is a member of the Southern Regional Education Board (SREB) which approves participating state institutions offerings within member states. Once Texas joins, the DCCCD colleges can participate in the national efforts.

The Department of Education is recommending compliance by July 1, 2018. The Coordinating Board is expected to be designated as the Texas SARA portal agency.
